Koalisi CSO OGP Indonesia Akan Berpartisipasi Pada 2025 Ogp Asia And The Pacific Regional Meeting Bgc, Manila, Philippines, 4-8 Februari 2025

Pertemuan Regional Asia dan Pasifik Open Government Partnership (OGP) 2025 di Manila, Filipina (4-8 Februari 2025) menjadi wadah penting bagi OGP Regional dan OGP di Indonesia, khususnya bagi organisasi masyarakat sipil (CSO). Pertemuan ini diharapkan dapat mengakselerasi pelaksanaan OGP di regional sekaligus tahapan menuju OGP Summit 2025 di Vitoria-Gasteiz, Spanyol (7-9 Oktober 2025).
